vehicle in which HC Krishan Chand among other police personnel of JKAP 9th Bn were on their way to battalion Headquarters, Zewan and had just reached to Pantha Chowk, Srinagar after the "stand-down" of the nafri from Law & Order duty assigned for the particular day, two unknown militants all of a sudden appeared on the road and attacked/started indiscriminate firing on the said police vehicle as a result four police personnel of JKAP 9th Bn including HC Krishan Chand No. 419/ JKAP 9th sustained serious bullet injuries. He was shifted to 92 Base Hospital Badami Bagh, Srinagar for treatment but doctors declared him as

"brought dead". The incident report of his martyrdom/ death incident was lodged at Police Station Pantha Chowk, Srinagar vide FIR No.56 of 2017 .

Shabir Ahmad Dar is survived by his 70 year old father Jenab Abdul Rehman Dar, 60 year old mother Mohtarma Hafeeza Begum, 25 year old wife Mrs.Rehana, 13 month old son Ayan Shabir, two married sisters Mst. Mehbooba, Mst.Rakeeba Rehman, one unmarried Sister Ms.Zahida Bano and two brothers Mr.Shaid Ul Rehman(25) and Mr. Imran Ul Rehman(21).

10. Late Dy.SP Mohammad Ayoub Pandith PID No.EXK-901803

Mr. Mohammad Ayoub Pandith S/O Jenab Gh.Ahmad Pandith resident of Nowpora, Khanyar, Srinagar was born on April 28, 1960. He did Masters Degree in Commerce and LLB from University of Kashmir. On his selection and appointment, Mr. Mohammad Ayoub Pandith joined J&K Police as Sub Inspector on November 19, 1990. Subsequently, he was promoted as inspector and Dy.Superintendent of Police. He completed basic training successfully at SKPA Udhampur on December 03, 1991. In Police department, he rendered useful services in different capacities which include his assignments during his posting in District Pulwama from 1/92 to 07/94, District Srinagar from 8/94 to 11/98, CID Organization from 12/98 to 11/2000, Security Kashmir from 12/2000 to 04/2003, AHJ Srinagar from 5/2003 to 11/2003, Security Headquarters J&K from 12/2003 to 02/2005, District Baramulla from 03/2005 to 08/2005, Vigilance Organization Kashmir from 09/2005 to 02/2008, District Anantnag from 03/2008 to 04/2010, District Kulgam from 05/2010 to 01/2013, Railway Kashmir from 02/2013 to 07/2014 and JKAP 3rd Security Bn from 08-08-2014 to 22-06-2017.

During the intervening night of June 22 & 23, 2017, when Dy.SP Mohammad Ayoub Pandith of JKAP 3rd Security battalion was on his legitimate duty at Jamia Masjid Nowhatta in Srinagar district in connection with Shab-i-Qader, Some anti national elements attacked and lynched him to death. Mr.Gowhar Ahmad Tantray S/O Jenab Nazir Ahmad resident of Kujjar joined Jammu and Kashmir Police as Constable in the year 2016. During his posting in District Shopian when Ct Gowhar Ahmad was on way from Kanjikulla towards Yaripora on his motor Cycle on July 26, 2017 he was attacked by unknown terrorists. In the ensuing attack, Ct. Gowhar Ahmad attained martyrdom on July 26, 2017.

Late Constable Gowhar Ahmad is survived by his wife Mrs. Ruby Jan, father Jenab Nazir Ahmad, mother Mohtarma Hasina Begum, two sisters Ms.Ishrat Jan & Rafi Jan, three brothers Mr. Sajad Ahmad, Parvaiz Ahmad and Mr.Shabir Ahmad.

12. Late Sgct Khursheed Ahmad Tak No.585/Kgm, PID No.EXK-012047

Mr. Khursheed Ahmad Tak S/O Jenab Gull Mohammad Tak after his schooling from Government Higher Secondary School Devsar joined J&K Police as a Constable in the year 2001. During his posting in District Kulgam, Sgct. Khursheed Ahmad and other police personnel were travelling in a police vehicle in Danaw Kandimarg area on October 14, 2017. Some unknown terrorists with their illegal weapons fired indiscriminately on the said police vehicle at Nadimarag crossing as a result four police personnel including Sgct. Khursheed Ahmad on board sustained bullet injuries. Sgct. Khursheed Ahmad however later on succumbed to his injuries on 14-10-2017. A case under FIR No.106/2017 has been registered in Police Station D.H.Pora.

Late Sgct Khursheed Ahmad is survived by his 60 year old father Jenab Gull Mohammad Tak, 35 year old wife Mrs. Neelofar Jan, 11 year old son Habil Khursheed, 07 year old daughter Fazika Khursheed and four married sisters Mst. Haleema Bano, Mst. Shameema Bano, Mst. Akthera Bano and Mst. Syara Bano.

13. Late SPO Abdul Haleem Gojjar (Kohli) No. 38/SPO

Mr. Abdul Haleem Gojjar son of Jenab Fatah Gojjar resident of Gutroo Tral was engaged as SPO (Special Police Officer) in J&K Police. During his engagement as SPO in Police District Awantipora, SPO Abdul Haleem Gojjar was fired upon by unknown militants outside his residential house at Gutroo Tral resulting into his on spot death on 18-10-2017. A case under FIR No.76/2017 stands registered in Police Station Tral.

Martyr SPO Abdul Haleem Gojjar (Kohli) is survived by his two wives Mrs. Shakeela Akhter (30) and Mrs. Shameema (27), four sons Shakeel Ahmad Gojjar (17 years), Zubair Ahmad Gojjar (15 years), Showkat Ahmad (10 Years), Ishfaq Ahmad (6 years) and five daughters Jameela (5 years), Qurat-ul-Ain (7 months), Saima (05 years), Bisma (04 years) and Ruqiya (02 months).

14. Late Constable Zaheer Abass No.389/S, PID No. EXK-022380, P.C. Hajan

Born on February 02, 1981, Mr. Zaheer Abass Khan S/O Jenab Mohammad Taj Khan, resident of Kaller, Mohra, Poonch joined Jammu and Kashmir Police as Constable on December 24, 2002. During his posting in Police Component Hajin (Bandipora), Mr. Zaheer Abass Khan attained martyrdom on 29-10-2017 during militants' attack at Mir Mohalla

Hajin in District Bandipora.

Brief facts of the incident are that on receipt of specific inputs by the Police Station Hajin about the presence of militants at Mir Mohalla Hajin of District Bandipora on October 29, 2017, a cordon & search operation (CASO) was jointly laid by 13 RR, CRPF 45 Bn, SHO P/S Hajin alongwith P/S nafri accompanied by ASP Bandipora, Dy.SP PC Hajin, Dy.SP PC Bandipora and SDPO Sumbal under the overall supervision of SSP District Bandipora. During the CASO, the militants hidden in the village fired upon cordon party indiscriminately as a result Constable Zaheer Abass Khan who was also the part of the aforesaid joint cordon party, got seriously injured. The injured Constable was shifted to Hospital for treatment where he was declared as "brought dead" by the doctors. Constable Zaheer Abass No. 389/S thus attained martyrdom on 29-10-2017. A case under FIR No.68/2017 stands registered in Police Station Hajin of District Bandipora

Martyr SgCt Zaheer Abass is survived by His father Jenab Mohd Taj Khan, mother Mohtarma Rasheeda Begum, wife Shiraz Akhter and two sons Mehtab Zaheer and Amanat Ali and a daughter Sumiya Zaheer.

15. Late ASI Abdul Rashid Shah No.13/A, PID No.EXK-822110

Mr. Abdul Rashid Shah S/o Jenab Mohammad Shah resident of Panzath, Wapora, Qazigund, Kulgam was born on February 17, 1962. He did his schooling in Govt. Middle School Yore Khoshipora Qazigund of District Anantnag. On his selection and appointment, Mr. Abdul Rashid joined J&K Police as Constable on July 21, 1982. During his posting in Police Station Anantnag, ASI Abdul Rashid attained martyrdom on 28-08-2017 while performing his duty near

Mahanadi Kadal Anantnag

On 28-08-2017, a group of militants fired upon ASI Abdul Rashid Shah and got him seriously injured. Owing to his deteriorating medical condition, ASI Abdul Rashid Shah was shifted to 92 Base Hospital Srinagar where he succumbed to his injuries.

Martyr ASI Abdul Rashid is survived by his two wives Mrs. Naseema Banoo and Mrs. Shagufta Akhtar, two daughters Ms. Bilkees Masood and Zohra Rashid and three sons Faisal Rashid, Irshad Rashid and Shakir.

16. Late Sgct Abdul Salam Khan No.246/PL

Sgct Abdul Salam Khan 246/PL S/o Jenab Mohd Maqbool Khan resident of Krewa Manloo, District Shopian attained martyrdom on 04-11-2017 while performing his legitimate duty.

During his posting in District Pulwama, on November 04, 2017, late Sgct Abdul Salam was a part of naka party near Police Station Rajpora. The said naka party was fired upon by Some unknown militants. During the incident, Sgct Abdul Salam Khan attained martyrdom.

Martyr Sgct Abdul Salam Khan is survived by his mother Mohtarma Kheteja Begum, wife Shahzada Akhter, three sons Sabir Salam, Shakir Salam and Vikas Salam and a daughter Afreena Salam

Four Police personnel posted in District Pulwama attained martyrdom on 26-08-2017

During a fedayeen attack carried out by militants at District Police Lines Pulwama on August 26, 2017, four police personnel attained martyrdom. The martyred police personnel are Late Constable Imtiyaz Ahmad 963/PL S/O Late Jenab Mohd Afzal Sheikh R/O Churat, District Kulgam, Late Nursing orderly Amarjeet Singh S/O

Jenab Jasvant Singh R/o Khampora Sarrie, District Budgam, Late SPO Mohd Rafiq No.327/SPO S/o Jenab Mohd Akram Hajam R/o Chandgam, District Pulwama and late SPO Mohd Yousuf Hajam No.54/SPO S/O Jenab Abdul Rehman Hajam R/O Chadgam District Pulwama.

On 26-08-2017, militants, three in number carried out fedayeen attack at district Police Lines Pulwama triggering an encounter between police and militants. In the ensuing encounter aforesaid four police personnel attained martyrdom.

17. Martyr Constable Imtiyaz Ahmad No. 963/PL

Martyr Constable Imtiyaz Ahmad No. 963/PL is survived by his wife Shahnava Akhter, daughter Adeeba Imtiyaz and son Haris Imtiyaz.

18. Martyr Amarjeet Singh, Nursing Orderly

Martyr Amarjeet Singh, Nursing Orderly is survived by his daughter Gurpreet Kour.

19. Martyr SPO Mohd Rafiq No.327/SPO

Martyr SPO Mohd Rafiq No.327/SPO is survived by his father Jenab Mohd Akram Hajam, mother Mst.Fata Begum and sister Jozy Jan.

20. Martyr SPO Mohd Yousuf Hajam No.54/SPO

Martyr SPO Mohd Yousuf Hajam No.54/SPO is survived by his father Jenab Abdul Rehman, mother Saja Begum, sister Ms.Kulsooma and a brother Parvaiz Rehman

21. Late SI Imran Hussain Tak No.156/PAU PID No.ARP-109264

Born on July 14, 1986 in village Mong of tehsil Ramnagar, district Udhampur, Mr. Imran Hussain Tak did Masters degree in Urdu. On his selection, he joined J&K Armed Police

as Sub Inspector on December 31, 2010. During his posting in SOG Srinagar, he attained martyrdom on 17-11-2017 while performing his legitimate duties.

Martyr Sub Inspector Imran Hussain Tak is survived by his father Jenab Abdul Lateif Tak, mother Mohtarma Naseema Begum, wife Mrs.Gulnaz Akhter and a minor daughter Alishaba Zaien.

On November 17, 2017 at about 1545 hrs, a joint naka established at Gulabbagh near seven Chinars, Zakura Srinagar by Police Station Zakura and Police Component Srinagar signalled one white santro car bearing registration No.JK01V/5593 to halt at the naka. But, the occupants of the vehicle opened fire indiscriminately on the naka party. Sub Inspector Imran Tak, PID No.ARP-109264 who was the part of the joint naka party was critically injured in the attack and was referred to hospital where he was declared as "brought dead". The police party retaliated and succeeded in apprehending one militant (affiliated with Tehriq-ul-Mujahidin outfit). A case of the said incident stands registered in Police Station Zakura under FIR NO.47/2017.

22. Late Constable Imtiyaz Ahmad, No. 1408/A

Mr. Imtiyaz Ahmad S/O Jenab Shakeel Ahmed Mir resident of Palpora, Noorbagh, Srinagar was posted as Constable in District Anantnag. During his posting in Police Post General Bus Stand Anantnag, Constable Imtiyaz Ahmad No.1408/A attained martyrdom on 09-09-2018 while he was on his legitimate duty. On the evening of September 9,2017, some unknown terrorists fired upon a police party near General Bus Stand Anantnag resulting into injuries to two police personnel including Constable Imtiyaz Ahmad No.

1408/A who succumbed to his injuries in the district hospital Anantnag. Martyr Constable Imtiyaz is survived by his aged parents, unmarried sister and two brothers one of them differently abled.

23. Late ASI ASHIQ HUSSAIN NO. 33/AWT, PID EXK- 972550

Mr. Ashiq Hussain was a resident of Baghat Hyder Chadoora Budgam. He was borne on May 29, 1975. He did his schooling from High School Hayatpora Chadoora & Baghat-i-Kanipora. After passing TDC he joined J&K Police on November 10, 1997 as Constable. Subsequently he was promoted as SgCT on July 1, 2005, Head Constable on March 31, 2010 and ASI on September 29, 2017.

During his service in J&K Police he remained posted in District Budgam, District Kupwara, District Srinagar, District Leh, District Shopian, District Pulwama and Police District Awantipora. He was awarded DGP Commendation Medal for Meritorious Services in the Year 2014.

During his posting in Police District Awantipora, ASI Ashiq Hussain attained martyrdom on 2.10.2017 at village Padgampora in an attack by Militants. On October 2, 2017 at about 2045 hours some unknown Militants entered in a tent where marriage ceremony of the daughter of one Ab Rashid Wani S/O Mohammad Sultan Wani was going on. The unknown Militants fired several gunshots with their illegally acquired weapon upon ASI Ashiq Hussain who happened to be present at the wedding location. A case under FIR No. 103/2017 stands registered in Police Station Awantipora. Martyr ASI Ashiq Hussain No.EXK-972550 is survived by his wife Mrs Shameema Bano, his daughter Qurat-ul-Ashiq and two sons Mir Afnan Ashiq & Mir Asrar Ashiq.

13th Central Police Welfare Committee Meeting held at PHQ Srinagar

13th Central Police Welfare Committee Meeting was held at PHQ Srinagar on August 19, 2017 under the Chairmanship of Director General of Police J&K Dr. S.P. Vaid IPS. A number of decisions taken on the occasion for the welfare of J&K Police are elaborated as under: -

Major decisions taken during the 13th Central Police Welfare Committee Meeting - 2017

01. Special Welfare relief to the NOK of Police Personnel who sacrifice their lives in the militancy related incidents/ Law & Order duties has been enhanced from rupees 12 lac to 15 lac (the immediate relief has also been enhanced from Rupees 50,000 to One lac)
02. Retirement Gift has been enhanced from Rs.50,000 to Rs.60,000
03. The Powers of various Welfare Committees have been enhanced for making purchases out of welfare fund. As per the decision taken, Central Committee has been given full powers. The powers of Range level committee has been enhanced from Rs.5000 to Rs.6000 and the Powers of District/ Unit level committee has been enhanced from Rs.500 to Rs.2000 to make purchases out of welfare fund.
04. Spectacles charges have been enhanced from Rs.1000 to Rs.1500.
05. Provision of 'Bada Khana' from the welfare fund has been abolished.
06. Meritorious Scholarship shall be available for the wards of Serving Police Personnel of the Rank of NGO and Ors. including Inspectors promoted as DySPs on their own pay and grade (OPG) from Class 10th and onwards as per the following Percentage/ Scale:
 - a) In Class 10th, 12th, Graduation and Post-Graduation level, the wards of serving police personnel and SPOs (Special Police Officers) who get 90.1% marks shall be entitled for Meritorious Scholarships worth Rs.6000, Rs.7200, Rs.12000 and Rs.18000 respectively. Whereas, the wards of serving police personnel and SPOs (Special Police Officers) who get 80% to 90% marks in 10th, 12th, Graduation and Post-Graduation level shall be entitled for Meritorious Scholarships worth Rs.4000, Rs.6000, Rs.8500 and Rs.12000 respectively. Expenditure on account of Meritorious scholarships in respect of wards of SPOs (Special Police Officers) shall however be debited to Police Pariwar fund.
 - b) Wards of Gazetted Officers shall not be eligible for such scholarships.
 - c) Scholarship in respect of wards of deceased Police personnel (who dies due to other than militancy related incidents) has been enhanced from Rs.3000 to Rs.5000 p.a.
07. Subject to liquidation of previous welfare loan, the limit of chances for sanction of welfare loan has now been extended upto five chances in case of life terminal disease.
08. The average ceiling for grant of welfare relief in respect of retired police personnel by CPWC has been fixed upto Rs.50,000 with enhancement in monthly contribution towards funds from Rs.2 to Rs.10 per month for all ranks.
09. The existing power of District SSsP for grant of relief in respect of Retired Police Personnel has been enhanced from Rs.1000 to Rs.2000.
10. Coaching facilities for professional Entrance Examinations for wards of Police Personnel shall now be made available at Police Public School Jammu and Srinagar.
11. Provision of relief in respect of SPOs (Special Police Officers) seriously injured in Law & Order duties has been enhanced upto Rs.1,00,000 in exceptional cases out of Police Pariwar Fund.
12. Special welfare relief in respect of SPOs (Special Police Officers) has been enhanced from Rs.2,00,000 to Rs.2,50,000 in the event of death of the SPOs (Special Police Officers) during his engagement. (The immediate relief has also been enhanced from Rs.10,000 to Rs.30,000). At the same time the monthly contribution towards SPOs (Special Police Officers) contributory fund has been enhanced from existing Rs.40 to Rs.50 per head.
13. Wards of Police Martyr pursuing PG Courses through Distance Education shall be considered for Scholarship for one stream only.

Cryptocurrency

Before understanding Cryptocurrency/ Bitcoins, I would like to go into history of "money"

Earlier there was a "Barter System" in vogue but due to problem in its durability and portability, it was not preferred. E.g exchange of grains/ cattle etc was cumbersome affair. This system was replaced with precious metals like Gold/ Silver etc. People started depositing gold etc to goldsmith and they acted as Bankers and taking paper receipts. This gave an idea of paper currency. This is known as Fiat money having no value of it but Govt. promises and assign value. The Banking concept came into being and for money transfer "Banks" act as "Third party" for validating and facilitating the transaction/ money transfer. It used to take days to complete money transfer with considerable charges on money transfer.

With the introduction of internet, the plastic money in the form of Credit cards / Debit card ATMs etc came into being. The electronic transaction was started by banks charging on customers.

In all Bank related cases the frauds, Sub-prime crisis and monopolistic attitude of Banks, one Japanese namely Satoshi Nakamoto mooted an idea of Crypto currency/ Digital Currency which will be free from third party (Bank) and free from Govt. accountability/ interference. The 2008/ 2009 and 2010 witnessed a quite good response/ gaining popularity.

In short a cryptocurrency is a digital currency that is created and managed through the use of advanced



encryption techniques known as cryptography. Cryptocurrency made the leap from being an academic concept to (virtual) reality with the creation of Bitcoin in the year 2009. Bitcoin is a Crypto Currency/ Virtual or Digital money- Rather an online version of cash.

Bitcoin – The current standard.

Bitcoin is a decentralized currency that uses peer-to-peer technology, which enables all functions such as currency issuance, transaction processing and verification to be carried out collectively by the network. While this decentralization renders Bitcoin free from government manipulation or interference, the flipside is that there is no central authority to ensure that things run smoothly or to back the value of a Bitcoin. Bitcoins are created digitally through a "mining" process that requires powerful computers to solve complex algorithms and crunch numbers. They are currently created

at the rate of 25 Bitcoins every 10 minutes and will be capped at 21 million, a level that is expected to be reached in 2140.

These characteristics make Bitcoin fundamentally different from a fiat currency, which is backed by the full faith and credit of its government. Fiat currency issuance is a highly centralized activity supervised by a nation's central bank. While the bank regulates the amount of currency issued in accordance with its monetary policy objectives, there is theoretically no upper limit to the amount of such currency issuance. In addition, local currency deposits are generally insured against bank failures by a government body. Bitcoin, on the other hand, has no such support mechanisms. The value of a Bitcoin is wholly dependent on what investors are willing to pay for it at a point in time. As well, if a Bitcoin exchange folds up, clients with Bitcoin balances have no recourse to get them back.

In Dubai Blockchain technology/ Ethereum projects involving such technology in business, contracts, Govt. offices etc may dispense with Lawyers Immigrant offices etc.

Alternatives to Bitcoin

Despite its recent issues, Bitcoin's success and growing visibility since its launch has resulted in a number of companies unveiling alternative cryptocurrencies, such as:

Litecoin – Litecoin is regarded as Bitcoin's leading rival at present, and it is designed for processing smaller transactions faster. It was founded in October 2011 as "a coin that is silver to Bitcoin's gold," according to founder Charles Lee. Unlike the heavy computing power is required for Bitcoin mining, Litecoins can be mined by a normal desktop computer. Litecoin's maximum limit is 84 million – four times Bitcoin's 21-million limit – and it has a transaction processing time of about 2.5 minutes, about one-fourth that of Bitcoin.

Ripple – Ripple was launched by OpenCoin, a company founded by technology entrepreneur Chris Larsen in 2012. Like Bitcoin, Ripple is both a currency and a payment system. The currency component is XRP, which has a mathematical foundation like Bitcoin. The payment mechanism enables the transfer of funds in any currency to another user on the Ripple network within seconds, in contrast to Bitcoin transactions, which can take as long as 10 minutes to confirm.

MintChip – Unlike most cryptocurrencies, MintChip is actually the creation of a government institution, specifically the Royal Canadian Mint. MintChip is a smartcard that holds electronic value and can transfer it securely from one chip to another. Like Bitcoin, MintChip does not need personal identification;

unlike Bitcoin, it is backed by a physical currency, the Canadian dollar.

The future.

Some of the limitations that cryptocurrencies presently face – such as the fact that one's digital fortune can be erased by a computer crash, or that a virtual vault may be ransacked by a hacker – may be overcome in time through technological advances. What will be harder to surmount is the basic paradox that bedevils cryptocurrencies – the more popular they become, the more regulation and government scrutiny they are likely to attract, which erodes the fundamental premise for their existence.

While the number of merchants who accept cryptocurrencies has steadily increased, they are still very much in the minority. For cryptocurrencies to become more widely used, they have to first gain widespread acceptance among consumers. However, their relative complexity compared to conventional currencies will likely deter most people, except for the technologically adept.

A cryptocurrency that aspires to become part of the mainstream financial system may have to satisfy widely divergent criteria. It would need to be mathematically complex (to avoid fraud and hacker attacks) but easy for consumers to understand; decentralized but with adequate consumer safeguards and protection; and preserve user anonymity without being a conduit for tax evasion, money laundering and other nefarious activities. Since these are formidable criteria to satisfy, is it possible that the most popular cryptocurrency in a few years' time could have attributes that fall in between heavily-regulated fiat currencies and today's cryptocurrencies? While that possibility looks remote, there is little doubt that

as the leading cryptocurrency at present, Bitcoin's success (or lack thereof) in dealing with the challenges it faces may determine the fortunes of other cryptocurrencies in the years ahead.

Many Countries including India are in no mood to legalise the Cryptocurrency and Law enforcement agencies/ Income Tax authorities etc are alert to thwart any move of anybody to involve in such transaction.

Countries that say Yes to Bitcoin.

The fact that bitcoin can be anonymously used to conduct transactions between any account holders, anywhere and anytime across the globe, makes it attractive to criminal elements. They may use bitcoins to buy or sell illegal goods like drugs or weapons. Most countries have not clearly made determinations on the legality of bitcoin, preferring instead to take a wait-and-see approach. Some countries have indirectly assented to the legal usage of bitcoins by enacting some regulatory oversight. However, bitcoin is never legally acceptable as a substitute for a country's legal tender.

The United States, Canada, Australia, The European Union, Finland, Belgium, United Kingdom (UK), Bulgaria and Germany is open to bitcoin; it is considered legal but taxed differently depending upon whether the authorities are dealing with exchanges, miners, enterprises, or users.

Countries that say No to Bitcoin.

While bitcoin is fairly welcomed in many parts of the world, there are few countries which are wary of bitcoin because of its volatility, decentralized nature, perceived threat to the current monetary system, and link to illicit activities like drug dealing and money laundering. Some of these nations have outright banned the digital currency while others have tried

to cut off any support from the banking and financial system essential for its trading and usage.

Iceland, Vietnam, Bolivia, Kyrgyzstan, Ecuador, Russia and China

The bottom line

Although Bitcoin is now five years into existence, countries still do not have explicit systems that restrict, regulate, or ban the cryptocurrency. The decentralized and anonymous nature of bitcoin has challenged many governments on how to allow legal use while preventing criminal transactions. Most countries are still analyzing ways to properly regulate the the cryptocurrency. Overall, bitcoin remains in a grey area as the technological leap has left lawmakers far behind.

Cryptocurrency in India

New Delhi: The ministry of finance cautioned people against the risks of investing in virtual currencies such as bitcoin which lack government fiat, comparing them with ponzi schemes.

This follows a crackdown by South Korean government on trading of bitcoins which led to a 8% drop in its value on Thursday. Currently, the value of bitcoin is around \$14,000.

"There has been a phenomenal increase in recent times in the price of Virtual 'Currencies' (VCs) including Bitcoin, in India and globally. The VCs don't have any intrinsic value and are not backed by any kind of assets. The price of Bitcoin and other VCs therefore is entirely a matter of mere speculation resulting in spurt and volatility in their prices," as claimed by the ministry said in a recently issued official statement.

The finance ministry warned that there is a real and heightened risk of investment bubble in VCs of the type seen in ponzi schemes which can result in sudden and prolonged crash exposing investors, especially retail

consumers losing their hard-earned money. "Consumers need to be alert and extremely cautious as to avoid getting trapped in such Ponzi schemes".

As announced by the finance ministry, the users, holders and traders of VCs have already been cautioned three times, in December 2013, February 2017 and December 2017, by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) about the potential financial, operational, legal, customer protection and security-related risks that they are exposing themselves to by investing in bitcoin and/ or other VCs.

"RBI has also clarified that it has not given any licence/ authorization to any entity/ company to operate such schemes or deal with Bitcoin or any virtual currency. The Government also makes it clear that VCs are not legal tender and such VCs do not have any regulatory permission or protection in India. The investors and other participants therefore deal with these VCs entirely at their own risk and should best avoid participating therein".

Blockchain: Benefits of this emerging technology beyond cryptocurrencies

Blockchain is seeing a big traction in India. Here's what the emerging technology has to offer.

Blockchain has become the latest buzz word in the digital space. Ever since cryptocurrencies, such as bitcoins, shot through the roof in terms of valuations, there has been a big interest in the technology.

The blockchain technology has recently seen an increased adoption and push from major tech companies, including the likes of IBM and Microsoft. Apart from the private sector, the governments are also mulling over implementing the technology.

India, which is one of the biggest

economies in the world and recently kick-started its transition to a full-fledged digital economy, is also keen on exploring the technology.

"The government does not consider cryptocurrencies legal tender or coin and will take all measures to eliminate use of these crypto-assets in financing illegitimate activities or as part of the payment system. The government will explore use of blockchain technology proactively for ushering in digital economy," finance minister Arun Jaitley had said while presenting the Union Budget 2018-19. The exclusion of cryptocurrencies from the blockchain technology has left a lot of people amused. But contrary to popular belief, blockchain has to offer more than just the cryptocurrencies.

Why blockchain?

One of the biggest problems that the technology can solve is doing away with the opacity in the financial transactions and minimising the risks of fraud. Promoters of blockchain technology say data cannot be altered while a decentralised network ensures it's more secure than the traditional centralised system.

"Fundamentally, blockchain enables participants to exchange value without the need for intermediaries. At its core, a blockchain is a data structure that is used to create a digital transaction ledger that, instead of resting with a single provider, is shared among a distributed network of computers," said a senior Microsoft India executive.

"The result is a more open, transparent, and verifiable system that will fundamentally change the way we think about exchanging value and assets, enforcing contracts and sharing data. A growing number of enterprises are investing in blockchain as a secure and transparent way to

digitally track the ownership of assets across trust boundaries, reimagine shared business processes and create new models for cross-organisational collaboration.”

“It cannot be tampered with, cannot be destroyed and the records kept using blockchain are not owned by an individual authority reducing centralised control and making things more transparent and democratic”.

Beyond cryptocurrencies

Blockchain can be used for a variety of sectors including banking, data management, insurance settlement platform, accelerate government schemes, and so on.

“Slowly, people will realise the potential of this technology and incorporate it in multifaceted areas. In India, it can definitely stop the trend of frauds making the financial sector more transparent with high-value dependency. Accounting, in the next 5–10 years, will be moving to multiple book-keeping system which is immutable and transparent for the government. India being one of the youngest countries, this technology can be understood by us to adapt. India needs to see cryptocurrencies as something more than just an investment tool and learn how to use this technology to make society a better place”.

“The evidence of blockchain’s potential to impact the digital economy could be seen through its adoption across industries like banking and finance, manufacturing, retail and e-commerce. The technology has immense potential to enable the government to work more efficiently. By utilising the secure, distributed, and inexpensive database technology of blockchain, the government would be able to validate many types of redundant documentation in the

public sector. Preserving digital records could reduce the transaction costs in the economy”.

“The technology could also empower civil society and create new financial incentives for public goods. For example, a public asset registry — could unlock affordable finance for small businesses and individuals, currently under-served by the financial system. Overall, the technology enables much safer and smoother transactions, while decentralising the operations without the need of intermediaries.”

Blockchain: India adoption

Blockchain, no matter how futuristic it may sound, is already gaining traction in India, especially after a mention in the Union budget.

For instance, a few players in Banking, Financial services and Insurance (BFSI) and IT industries have started work in this direction. The State Bank of India is expected to implement the blockchain technology by end of the fiscal year 2019.

Primechain has also formed BankChain, a consortium of 30 banks that includes State Bank of India (SBI), ICICI Bank, DCB Bank, Kotak Bank, Bank of Baroda, Deutsche Bank, and others, wherein these banks will use Microsoft Azure Blockchain as the underlying blockchain platform.

Niti Aayog, the government’s premier policy-making body, is also looking to leverage the use of blockchain technology in legally approved areas such as education, health and agriculture.

“In the global ecosystem, where billions of people are doing businesses and depend upon the financial system for their survival, blockchain has easily ventured into this space because of the opportunities it holds. A FinTech revolution is on its way globally as well

as locally. Multiple startups are coming up with wallets, better facilities for a non-border globe to facilitate smoother operations in various sectors. Countries like Venezuela and Zimbabwe have their own legal tenders now but have high volatile value. What countries need to understand is what the purpose of this technology is and where can it be used”.

The day is not far off when the concept of Bitcoin Crypto Currency will be adopted in India

CONCLUSION

The world of cryptocurrencies is one of the most divisive topics in finance right now. On the one hand, figures like J.P. Morgan CEO Jamie Dimon have called it a “fraud” and dubbed those trading it “stupid.” On the other hand, there are those who see cryptocurrencies as one of the most revolutionary forces in finance.

But amid the debate, there are a lot of people asking how to value this stuff and why bitcoin has traded nearly as high as \$20,000.

The emergence of Bitcoin has sparked a debate about its future and that of other cryptocurrencies. Despite Bitcoin’s recent issues, its success since its 2009 launch has inspired the creation of alternative cryptocurrencies such as Litecoin, Ripple and MintChip. A cryptocurrency that aspires to become part of the mainstream financial system would have to satisfy very divergent criteria. While that possibility looks remote, there is little doubt that Bitcoin’s success or failure in dealing with the challenges it faces may determine the fortunes of other cryptocurrencies in the years ahead.

We have to look beyond the Cryptocurrency if we want to use Blockchain technology in secure means.

Government sanctions Five Women Police Station with staff in J&K

Jammu & Kashmir Government accorded sanction to the creation of five Women Police Stations, one each in the Districts of Pulwama, Kupwara, Kathua, Doda and Leh. The Government also accorded sanction to the creation of 260 posts for these five Women Police Stations (52 posts for each P/S @ 01 Inspector, 01 SI, 02 ASIs, 06

HCs, 34 Constables (Direct) and 08 Followers per police Station). The jurisdiction of these five Women Police Stations will however be separately notified by the Home Department in consultation with the Police Headquarters J&K. Orders No.1849-Home of 2017 Dated 22-12-2017 and 1850-Home of 2017 Dated 22-12-2017 were issued to

this effect by the Government of J&K Home Department pursuant to Cabinet Decision No.234/13/2017 dated 21-12-2017.

It is pertinent to mention here that six Women Police Stations are presently functioning in the state one each in districts of Jammu, Rajouri, Udhampur, Srinagar, Anantnag and Baramulla.

Ex-Gratia for NOKs of JKP martyrs raised at par with CAPFs

On the projection of demand by the Government of Jammu & Kashmir, the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) Government of India has announced that the next of kin of Jammu and Kashmir Police martyrs would now get Rs 30 lakh ex-gratia.

An order to this effect was issued on December 6, 2017 which reveals that the family members of Jammu and Kashmir Police personnel, martyred during the course of performing duties attributed to act of violence in the State, would get Rs 30 lakh including Rs 18 lakh from Government of Jammu Kashmir (State budget), Rs 7 lakh from Ministry of Home Affairs (Police Welfare

Fund) and Rs.5 lakh from Ministry of Home Affairs (J&K, Security Related Expenditure, Relief and Rehabilitation) through Government of Jammu Kashmir.

The MHA will make payment of Rs 7 lakh in place of Rs 3 lakh to the next of kin of each J&K Police martyr from the Police Welfare Fund. The other terms and conditions for sanction of the amount of Rs 7 lakh from Police Welfare Fund would be the same. MHA will also make payment of Rs 5 lakh in place of Rs 2 lakh to the next of kin of Jammu and Kashmir Police personnel/ Special Police Officers as well as next of kin of Central Armed Police Forces/ Army

The existing terms and conditions/ guidelines for grant of ex-gratia relief from SRE (R&R) of Rs 5 lakh in place of Rs 2 lakh would continue.

The death during performing duties included death during violence by terrorists and anti-social elements etc.

J&K cabinet approves State Police Service Cadre creation

The Jammu and Kashmir Government sanctioned creation of State Police Service Cadre.

The decision to this effect was taken at a cabinet meeting chaired by Hon'ble Chief Minister Jammu and Kashmir Ms. Mehbooba Mufti on June 07, 2017.

Under the Jammu and Kashmir Police Service Cadre, six posts — two posts of Inspector General and four posts of Deputy Inspector General — will be reserved for local officers.

Posts of SgCts enhanced from 25% to 50%

The Cabinet meeting chaired by Hon'ble Chief Minister J&K Ms. Mehbooba Mufti on June 07, 2017 accorded sanction to the enhancement of the percentage of posts of SgCts to 50%, from the existing 25% at constabulary level and upgradation of pay scale of Selection Grade Constable from existing grade pay of

Rs.2100/- to grade pay of Rs.2400/- in the pay band of Rs.5200-20200/-.

State Government vide Home Department order No. 183-F of 2017 dated 12.06.2017 had raised the percentage of Selection Grade Constables from existing 25% to 50% of the total sanctioned strength of the constabulary in J&K Police

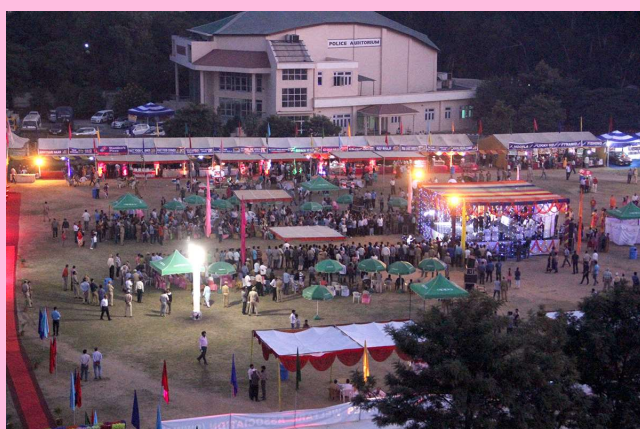

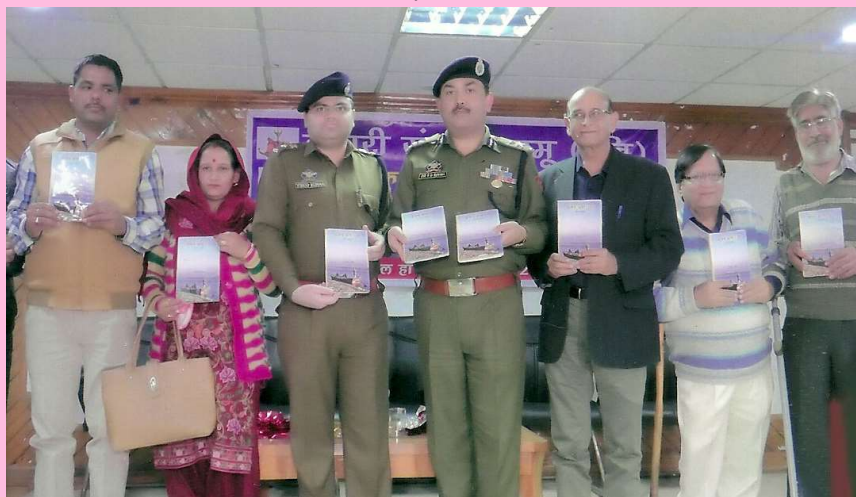

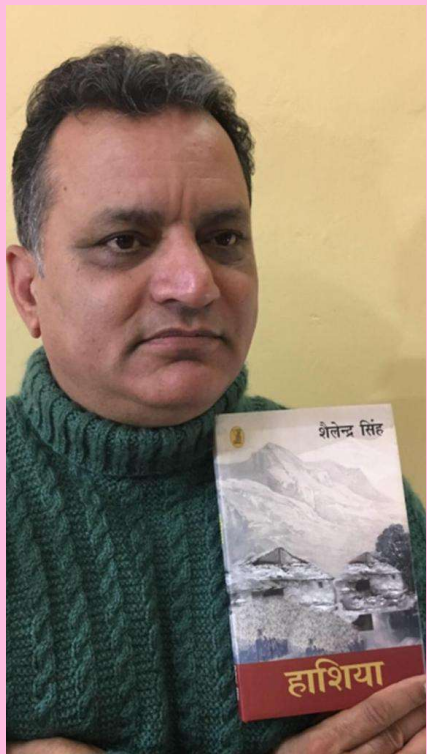

Police Headquarters J&K organized two days training programme of Special Juvenile police units at Srinagar on September 7 & 8, 2017. The training concluded at Police Headquarters Srinagar with the valedictory function.

Hon'ble Mr. Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey Judge, High Court of J&K (Chairperson J&K Juvenile Justice Committee) inaugurated the training programme of Special Juvenile Police units on September 7, 2017. On second day of training programme different speakers delivered lectures on Juvenile Justice Rules.

Ms. Sargun Shukla IPS, SP Traffic Kashmir, speaking on her topic "Initial Steps to Deal with Delinquent Juvenile" said that Juvenile Justice Rules have been made to provide protection to the juveniles who are in conflict with law. The first contact which a juvenile in conflict with law faces is Police and it is the responsibility of the Police Officer to ensure protection of the juvenile and ensure his/her security and privacy. A humanitarian approach needs to be adopted for such juveniles which is important to reform them and segregate them from the criminals.

Shri Mubassir Latifi, AIG (Personnel) PHQ, deliberating on the topic "Juvenile Delinquent and Role of Police" said that Juvenile Justice has defined various stake holders with their role in rehabilitation and reformation of the juvenile in conflict with the law. He touched all the aspects of police viz-a-viz juveniles and even cited certain case studies in which juveniles were involved including those juveniles who were in need of care and protection. He said that when any juvenile is found indulging in any offence, the police has the primary role to deal such juvenile. The role of other stake holders comes later. Though other stake holders like judiciary, social welfare department and NGOs have also a major role in providing protection and security to the juveniles in conflict with law, but the role of police is as a first responder and it is the duty of juvenile officer to help bring the child out of trauma.

Shri Gowhar Hussain Mir, Joint Director (Prosecution), PHQ spoke on the topic "Investigation of cases related to Juveniles" enlightened the participants about the procedure involved in cases where children are in conflict with law. He said that when a

police officer comes in contact with a juvenile in conflict with law, he or she has to ensure all measures for the protection and care of the juvenile and to inform his parents or guardian about the allegations and apprehension of the juvenile. He/she shall be provided all legal assistance besides enabling him to call any person of his choice. The juvenile in conflict with law shall be dealt in a child friendly manner and home like environment by the specially trained Police Officer in civvies. He shall be made responsible for the safety and provision of food and basic amenities to the apprehended juvenile, Joint Director (Prosecution) said. He also presented vote of thanks to the organizing committee, speakers as well as participants.

During the valedictory function held on September 09, 2017 at PHQ Srinagar, Shri V.K. Singh Special DGP Police Headquarters J&K in his valedictory speech thanked the PHQ team for extending their full support in organizing the training programme.

By annoying people, you won't succeed," Hon'ble Chief Minister told the cadets.

She said "Police have a big role in creating an atmosphere for the process of reconciliation and dialogue,"

Hon'ble Chief Minister reiterated "I will double the reward amount if you pull out a militant alive in the encounters or wherever he is found,"

The Chief Minister in a bid to raise the morale of cadets said, Police is a law abiding force, a well-trained force that protect people and help people in

getting justice.

Hon'ble CM further said almost all the demands of police department have been met. "I think all the cases have been resolved. Some 162 cases have been sent to GAD. The ex-gratia was raised from Rs 7 lakh to Rs 20 lakh and there was cadre review so that

policemen get their own identity. Pay anomalies were also addressed while ration money was increased.”

Hon'ble CM said there is a proposal to construct 5000 flats for policemen of which 3000 will be in Kashmir and 2000 in Jammu. “The proposal stands submitted to the GoI,”

Ms. Mehbooba Mufti sought police and people's cooperation in ending corruption.

Criminal Psychology and Forensic Evidence

The author of the topic "**Criminal Psychology and Forensic Evidence**" Dr. Nadeem Mubarik completed his post-graduation in botany from University of Kashmir and Ph.D. in Cytogenetics from Punjabi University Patiala. An organism, starting from less evolved to highly developed, like human beings, lives in a specific environment and as such, is modified accordingly with the external environmental stimuli. The behavior of an organism is dependent on the developmental stage of nervous system of that organism. More developed the nervous system, more phenotypic plasticity the organism will show and hence more complex the behavior of the organism will be. Despite being at the top of behavioral evolution, human beings like other organisms, have certain basic characteristics which are expressed under ambient external stimuli. These characters are not under the direct control of the individual, rather controlled by Autonomous Nervous System. For example, a person experiences extreme urination during stress, the heart rate escalates upon reading a sad news, etc. Similarly, human beings are evolved through ages with certain conserved basic characters which define the personality and moral character of the person. A person is born with these characters and ungrudgingly intends to cherish and follow these set of rules. **Satisfaction**, fulfillment of one's wishes and desires, as it is defined, is one of such characters that is the end result, the individual is fighting for. A person climbs a peak for some inner satisfaction, other person works the whole day with an expectation of receiving some gain at the end of the day, which brings him satisfaction. This tendency is not limited to humans only but extends to other animals also. A dog comes up with strong resentment upon seeing an infiltrator claiming his territory in a specific area and after giving infiltrator, a successful bid, feels highly satisfied. Therefore, it can be claimed that every individual intends to progress towards attaining greater and greater satisfaction levels. Whenever some hurdle comes in the way of the progress of attainment, it is attempted to be removed whether legally or illegally. These hurdles may be in the form of deprivation of wealth, property, gaining supremacy, avoiding competition, avoiding disturbances in personnel life, etc. Attaining satisfaction through these material factors may force the person to opt for legal as well as illegal ways/methods. Any factor which comes in between an individual and his objective of satisfaction can be met with serious consequences. Therefore, an individual opting for illegal ways of attaining satisfaction is said to have committed a crime. This is a deviation from the normal behavior of an individual and is termed as **Psychological disorder**. The concept that a psychological disorder will intern produce various signs, are actually the basis of various techniques of crime detection.

Similarly, another character that is inherent within the humans is to speak truth. A person who refrains from this inherent act and opts for an alternative by speaking a lie, is said to deviate from the normal behavior and is again noticed in the form of a physiological disorder producing various signs. In order to counter these physiological disorders, a person tries to develop some artificial behavior and this artificial behavior is not alone but is accompanied by various fluctuations in physiological parameters like blood pressure, heart rate, precipitation rates, secretion of saliva, dilation of pupil, etc., through the secretion of **epinephrine** of adrenal gland. However, the professional criminals and habitual liars are a serious drawback to this theory because they do not develop guilt as a result of extreme modification in their basic belief system and fundamentals through modified religious teachings, negative cognitive bias modification through cast, colour, etc. If there are certain mechanisms to detect these physiological changes, the perpetrator of the crime can be detected.

One more character, **Uniqueness** is considered as the most important factor in crime investigation. The admissibility of the eyewitness is based on the principal of uniqueness. Believing that every entity has some factor of uniqueness attached with it, is actually exploited in the courts. A person is unique believing that his fingerprints, skin colour, hair, eyes, blood group, etc. are unique to him with different degrees of uniqueness attached with them. The admissibility of eyewitness in the court of law as primary evidence has however been

challenged at various levels like; challenging the vision, challenging the memory, challenging the psychology, optical illusion, threats and fears, intentional deception, etc. therefore, moving forward all these factors need to be given due weightage so that a cumulative effect is developed to reach down to the root of a crime.

The evidences are of two types; **Direct** and **Indirect**. The direct evidences can be in the form of an eye witness or the evidence provided during dying declaration. Indirect evidences or circumstantial evidences can be of further two types as; **Subjective** and **Objective**.

i. **SUBJECTIVE EVIDENCE:** This type of evidence is based upon the personnel knowledge and expertise of an expert and can vary in accordance with the experience of the expert. If a person experiences certain disorder and consults a normal medical practitioner who has recently joined the profession. The doctor will, without doubt, advice certain precautions in diet and will put him on strict medication for a certain period. If the same patient goes for a successive consultation to a senior doctor and explains him about all the complications faced. The doctor, having seen a large number of such cases, will console the patient and conclude the disorder as a normal process of ageing and refrains from any dietary precaution and no medication. Both the doctors are correct, but have given the evidence as per their knowledge and expertise, are their respective subjective evidences. Similarly, if we have

an apple with a black spot on it, one person shall conclude it as a rotten apple and advise eating it should be avoided. Some other person shall conclude that there is nothing bad in it and the apple is fit to be eaten. Upon giving the opening both the persons shall use the words "according to me" the apple is fit or unfit for eating. This is also a subjective evidence of the two persons.

ii. **OBJECTIVE EVIDENCE:** If the black spotted apple, in the above quoted example, is subjected to various analytical methods like ascertaining the content of water available, sugar concentration and quality, presence of vitamins and minerals and their content percentage, presence of harmful ingredients, then only, it can be concluded whether the apple is fit for eating or not. But, this time the analyzer (expert) shall not use the words "according to me" rather say "according to scientific procedures" (or according to set rules) the apple is either fit or unfit for eating. Similarly in the earlier case, to bring in more objectivity in the opinion a panel of expert doctors shall be called for giving the opinion and the proceedings are done under audio-visual documentation.

Therefore, in order to get more reliable evidences, the subjectivity of the opinion needs to be converted in to more and more objectivity. This can be done through the use of modern scientific technology through forensic science. The more we move towards objective evidences, the more we are nearer to truth.
